Ontario Renovates Program

The Ontario Renovates Program provides funding to eligible low income homeowners who need financial assistance to make repairs to their home to bring it up to standard and make it a safe and healthy place to live.

Eligible repairs include:

- Heating, plumbing, electrical, structural and roofing.
- Structural modifications to make the home accessible for persons with physical disabilities may also be eligible.

Eligibility is determined based on the household income of the homeowner. You may qualify for financial assistance from the program if you are homeowner with a low income. The assistance is provided as a forgivable loan. Applications to receive funding through the Ontario Renovates Program are now being accepted.

PREFERENCE WOULD GO TO STINSON RESIDENTS WHO DON'T HAVE GARDEN SPACE OF THEIR OWN.

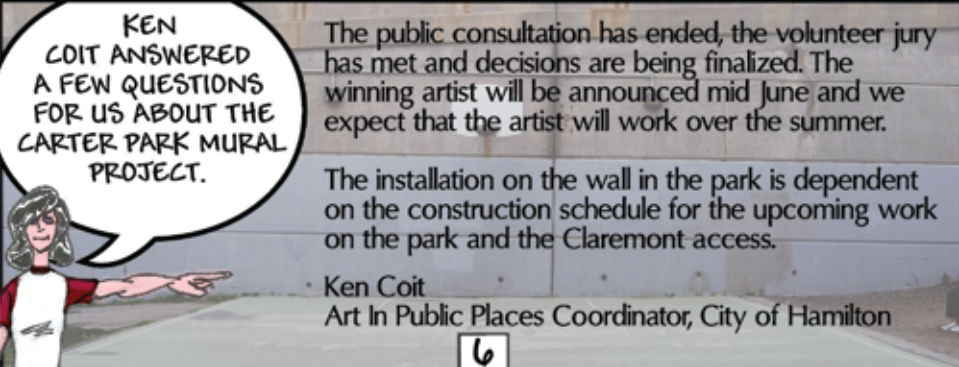

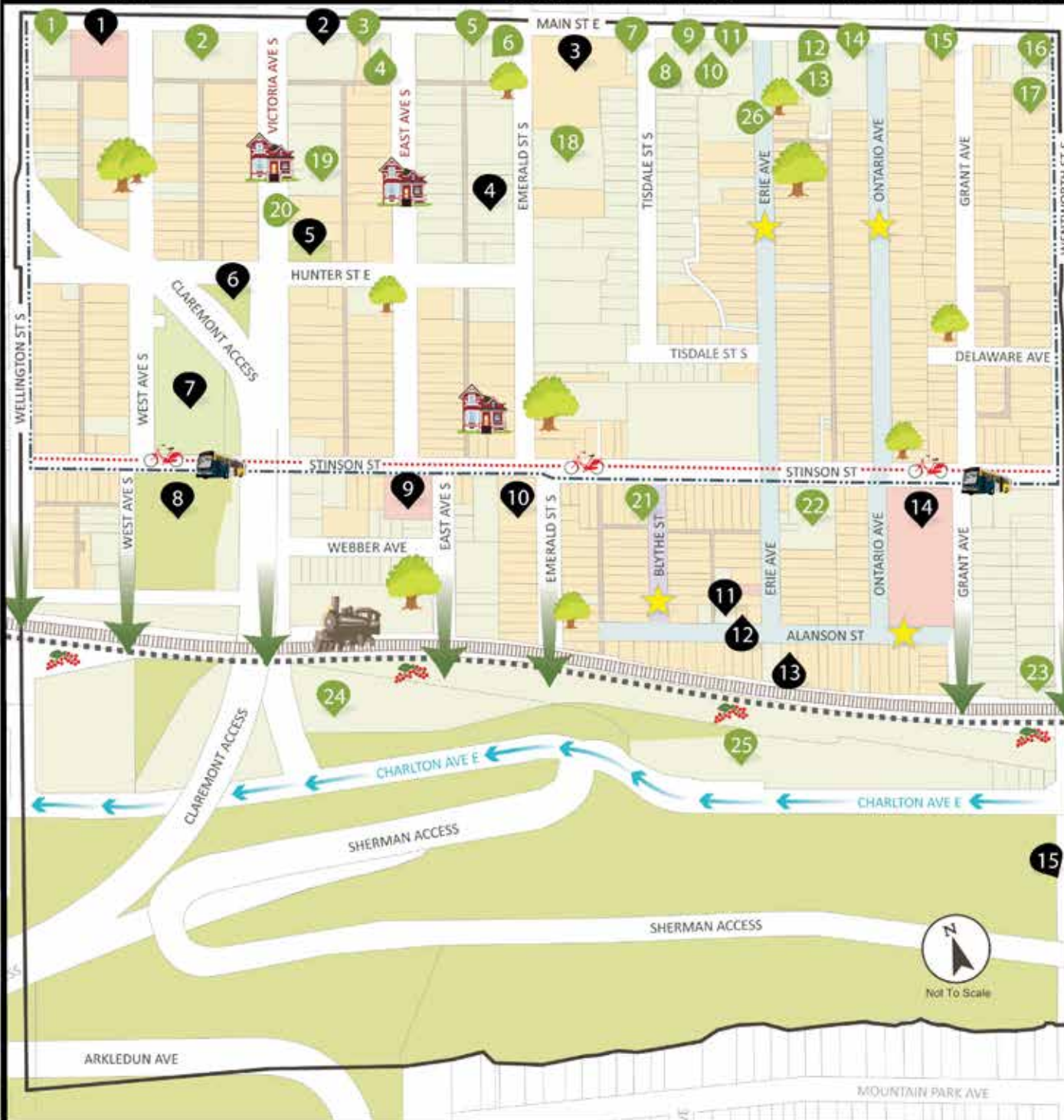

ZOE ON TOUR PT 11A: WALKING WITH MAGGIE - VICTORIA AVENUE

HELLO, ZOE. WOULD YOU LIKE TO TAKE A WALK WITH ME?

SURE, MAGGIE! WHERE TO?

AT ONE TIME THIS SOUTHERN END OF VICTORIA AVENUE WAS TREE LINED AND QUITE GRAND IN THE TRUE SENSE OF THE TERM. NOW IT IS AN ECLECTIC MIX OF COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS, WHICH ALSO SUPPORT A WIDE MAIN ARTERIAL ROAD THROUGH HAMILTON.



AS WE START THE WALK AT THE SOUTH WEST CORNER, THERE IS CANADIAN TIRE. THIS LOCATION HAS BEEN IN OPERATION SINCE 1934, AND WAS THE FIRST EVER 'ASSOCIATE' STORE TO OPEN OUTSIDE OF THE ORIGINAL IN TORONTO. ALTHOUGH IT COMPETES WITH THE LARGE BIG-BOX TYPE STORES, IT HAS BEEN RECENTLY RENOVATED (ALONG WITH THE GAS BAR OUTSIDE, THAT RETAINS A

RETRO 50'S LOOK), AND IS VERY WELL STOCKED FOR ITS SIZE. OUR NEIGHBOURHOOD WOULD SUFFER IF IT EVER CLOSED.

AS WE WALK SOUTH, WE REACH HUNTER STREET, AND HERE WE CAN SEE THAT VICTORIA AVENUE HAS NOT AGED WELL. ITS RESIDENTIAL PAST STRUGGLES TO MAINTAIN A PRESENCE, AND ALTHOUGH EACH SIDE OF THE STREET HAS HOUSES THAT ARE BEAUTIFULLY RESTORED, RETAINING THEIR GRACE AND BEAUTY, OTHERS OF THE SAME ERA ARE STRUGGLING TO HOLD ONTO THEIR ORIGINAL ELEGANCE. IT IS NEATLY SLICED IN TWO HERE, WHERE THE OFF-RAMP CURVES ITS WAY DOWN THE CLAREMONT ACCESS, MERGING TO BECOME A FOUR LANE HIGHWAY.

I CAN IMAGINE THE CHAOS CAUSED WHEN THIS HUGE MEGA-PROJECT FINALLY GOT UNDERWAY. ACCORDING TO A HAMILTON SPECTATOR ARTICLE ON NOVEMBER 1ST, 1951, THE INITIAL PROPOSALS WERE STILL BEING DEBATED FOR THE CLAREMONT ACCESS, AND THE FINAL ROUTE DOWN THE MOUNTAIN HAD NOT BEEN DECIDED, BUT ULTIMATELY VICTORIA AVENUE WAS CHOSEN OVER WENTWORTH AND JOHN STREET.

WALKING FURTHER WE CROSS STINSON STREET BRUSHING UP AGAINST THE HUGE WALLS OF THE OVERPASS.

ZOE ON TOUR PT 11B: WALKING WITH MAGGIE - VICTORIA AVENUE



ON THE SOUTH EAST CORNER ARE FOUR LOW RISE APARTMENT BLOCKS THAT NEATLY HIDE A STINSON GEM. IF YOU LOOK BETWEEN THE BUILDINGS, YOU WILL SEE A GRAND HOUSE THAT WAS AT ONE TIME A BEAUTIFUL FAMILY HOME.

WOW, MAGGIE! THIS IS GREAT! UH OH! WE'RE OUT OF SPACE!

OH, THAT'S ALRIGHT. THERE'S PLENTY OF ROOM ON THE WEBSITE.

IT WAS BUILT IN 1875 BY JOSEPH LISTER (LISTER BLOCK), BUT AS TIME WENT ON, IT WAS EVENTUALLY SOLD, AND ACCORDING TO A 1922 HAMILTON DIRECTORY, IT WAS LISTED AS WEBBER APARTMENTS. IN 1948, THE HOUSE AND LAND WAS SOLD TO A LOCAL CONTRACTOR WHO BUILT THE PRESENT APARTMENT BUILDINGS, AND THANKFULLY KEPT THE HOUSE. IF YOU GO UP TO THE FRONT DOORS, YOU CAN STILL SEE THE SURVIVING ORIGINAL ORNATE FEATURES, AND FEEL THE SPLENDOUR THIS HOUSE MUST HAVE CONTAINED.

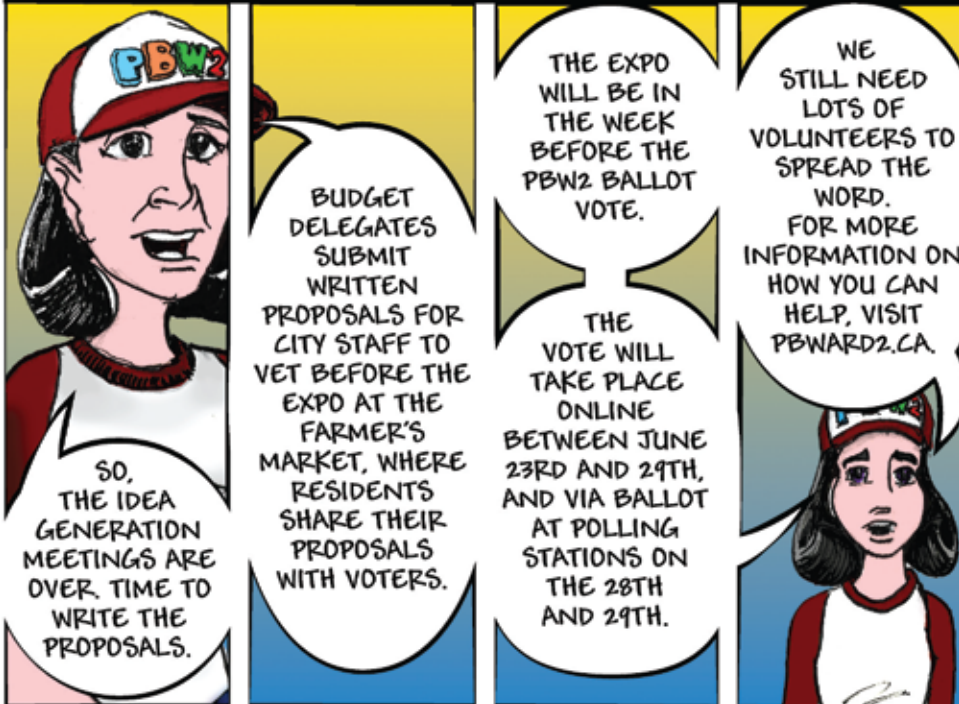


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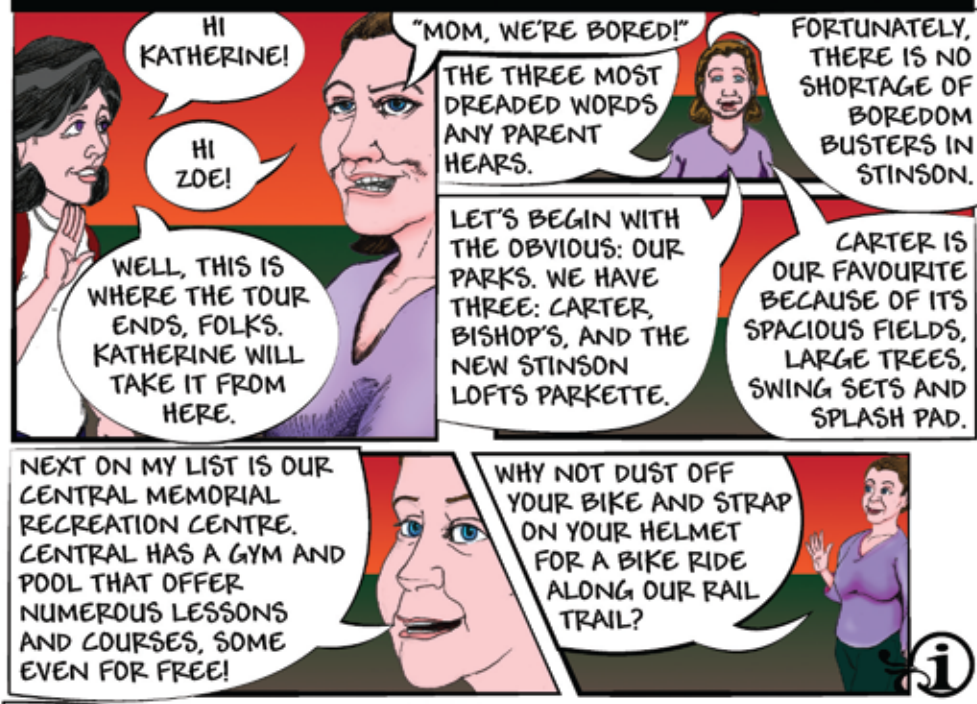
